The Los Angeles County Workforce Investment Board (WIB), which serves over 4 million residents in 58 of the County's 88 cities and 151 unincorporated areas, assists the L.A. County Board of Supervisors with policy and oversight of WIA Programs administered by Community and Senior Services and implemented by its system of 17 WorkSource Centers, 3 satellite One-Stop Centers and 16 WIA Youth Program Providers.

In 2011-12, new initiatives were adopted or expanded, including in areas such as Florence-Firestone, which

had the highest unemployment rate in the County at over 22.6% and for targeted groups such as Veterans, Re-entry and Ex-Offender Youth and Adults, as well as for Mature Workers. Based on research by LAEDC, the WIB committed to seven sectors: healthcare, construction, transportation and logistics, clean energy, hospitality and tourism, finance, and biotech in partnership with the L.A. Workforce Systems Collaborative that includes the L.A. City WIB, L.A. Community College District, LAUSD, United Way of L.A. and L.A. Area Chamber of Commerce.

GOODWILL FOR VETERANS

In Spring 2011, the L.A. County WIB approved a Veteran's Pilot Project, and selected Goodwill Southern California, one of its WorkSource Center operators, to implement it.

To date, over 5,000 Veterans have been served through universal access; 166 Veterans and their family members have been placed in jobs, and 100 have received training.

Goodwill hired Veterans to develop and manage the pilot project that will expand job training, placement and employment services and programs to thousands of veterans, as

well as their spouses and families. These program specialists, former Vets themselves, are uniquely qualified to respond to and address the special needs of those men and women who have served our country and now face the challenges of reintegrating into a civilian world suffering massive unemployment rates.

The staff provide one-on-one career counseling and access to employment preparation courses, educational and technical skills classes, and work tools all aimed at assisting



Veterans find meaningful employment so that they may advance beyond their military careers and regain a sense of pride, dignity and purpose.



Based at the City of L.A. WIB funded Metro North WorkSource Center near downtown Los Angeles, the team also performs as a highly mobile unit reaching all corners of Los Angeles County. These communities offer different resources and their Veteran communities present different needs. By developing relationships with various community and service organizations, colleges and businesses, the program has increased its visibility and is able to offer participants access to additional services such as health screenings,

grooming services, mental health and substance abuse counseling, Veterans Benefits Assistance and more.



FEMALE VETERANS' NETWORKING BREAKFAST



Former Goodwill Vice President Terri Kelsall had an idea to provide special resources and assistance to meet the needs of female Veterans. The idea gave birth to The Female Veterans' Networking Breakfast – a regular event, bringing Female Veterans together to connect, share, and network. The program has become quite a success: the first event of this kind brought 12 Female Veterans together and due to positive word of mouth between Vets, the last networking breakfast meeting had over

100 in attendance. Guest speakers have included Callie Wight, GLAHS Women Veterans Program Manager; Carla Williams, Senior HR Director; L.A. County's Veteran Internship Program; Via Van Liew from Mattel; and California State Secretary for Veteran Affairs, Peter Gravett.

The Female Veterans' Networking Breakfasts occurs the 3rd Thursday of every month from 9-11 am generally at Goodwill Southern California.

BOOTS TO SUITS



Goodwill Southern California organized the inaugural **Boots to Suits** event in L.A, Orange , Riverside, San Bernardino, Ventura and Santa Barbara counties February 15 -17.

915 Veterans were provided with free clothes for work (744 by Goodwill Southern California and 171 by Goodwill Serving the People of Southern L.A. County). The average age of the Vets was late 40s to early 50s and included a large number of homeless Veterans. Over \$38,000 in vouchers/free work attire were provided.

Messages from over 150 calls about employment services were left on their new 'Jobs for Vets hotline' and all of the calls are being processed .

Goodwill is considering a repeat event over Memorial Day Weekend (May 26, 27 and 28) when they expect to get an even stronger response because it will be held over a weekend and they will be able to have placement services /business services staff at their busiest stores to capture the most motivated job seekers.

THE GOLD CARD: NEW EMPLOYMENT INITIATIVES FOR VETERANS

There have been 1.4 million Vets deployed. 30,000 Veterans go back to the State of California annually. Over 20% of those vets return to L.A. County and 30% to Southern California. Nationally there are a total of 47% Veterans unemployed. The City of Los Angeles is ranked among the top 10 cities for servicemen returning.

The City and County of Los Angeles Workforce Investment Boards are committed to regional coordination and collaboration to ensure success with the implementation the new **Gold Card Initiative** for veterans. A Joint City and County WIB Veteran's Employment and Training Services Subcommittee was established in December 2011.

Some of the proposed goals are to:

- Expand co-location opportunities and case management for Veterans.
- Establish goals for WorkSource Centers
- Track training credentials for Vets, possible badges.
- Assist with needs other than employment, including extended benefits of community colleges.
- Create a new website and ensure there is visible signage on the Gold Card Initiative.
- Develop a resource book for Vets.
- Contact local universities to place interns in Work-Source Centers.

Approach US Chamber of Commerce and LA Area Chamber of Commerce to bring employers to table.

The **Gold Card** provides unemployed post-9/11 era veterans with the intensive and follow-up services they need to succeed in today's job market. The Gold Card initiative is a joint effort of the Department of Labor's Employment and Training Administration (ETA) and the Veterans' Employment and Training Service (VETS).

An eligible veteran can present the Gold Card at his/her local One-Stop Career Center to receive enhanced intensive services including up to six months of follow-up. The enhanced in-person services available for Gold Card holders at local One-Stop Career Centers may include:

- Job readiness assessment, including interviews and testing;
- Development of an Individual Development Plan (IDP);
- Career guidance through group or individual counseling that helps veterans in making training and career decisions;
- Provision of labor market, occupational, and skills transferability information that inform educational, training, and occupational decisions;
- Referral to job banks, job portals, and job openings;
- Referral to employers and registered apprenticeship sponsors;
- Referral to training by WIA-funded or third party service providers; and
- Monthly follow-up by an assigned case manager for up to six months.


